Received your latest communique was good to hear from back there again. Wanted to write sooner and thank the C.D.C [Collegiate Defense Committee] for the yearbook - it sure was the nicest present - I've received.

I'm about ready to move out of Birmingham - I expect to go the first part of next week - can't say I'll be sorry to move on - it really has been terrific here - I would like very much to head north a bit - but I'm afraid I'm heading further into the south.

See by your letter - that Bob is up to his old tricks I haven't heard from him in weeks - if I ever catch up with him - "woe be unto him"- I hear from Ed - quite often - got a card from Ledo he is in VA. [Virginia] - can't say he is in love with our branch of the service - but I imagine he will become more satisfied as

My next move from here is classification - in a very short time I am going to find out what the army intends to do with me after four long months - I'm interested no end - in finding out what is to be my lot.

They have been mighty rough on us here - the past few weeks each time we turned around we had a new class attached on to our schedule. They had us going to a Celestial Navigation Class from 8:45- 9:45 P.M. - remember Ledo and his Bowditch.

Well Miss McGlynn - I guess that's about all for now - I'll drop you a card with my new "home" address on it as soon as I land.
