Hello Miss McGlynn

Received another very welcomed news letter today - sure was good to hear from back there again.

A great deal has happened since I last wrote Salem - seen a lot more of the country to boot - never did expect to end up here at Chanute but I guess one never knows where he is headed - I was heading for Cadet Meterology [sic] - but unfortunately for me - cadet meterology [sic] has been cleared so they shipped me to weather school here at Chanute. I imagine Thistle went through about the same type of training I'm receiving here - It really is rugged - learning codes, weather symbols - plotting weather maps - charts - taking courses in meterology [sic] and other courses - They really keep us very busy - after I graduate

from here on Oct 13, - we are sent for our operational training to a weather region - which may or may not be in this country or this hemisphere for that matter - some of the fellows recently graduated from here have ended up in India, China, Iran - almost anywhere you would expect weathermen to be and places you wouldn't expect them.

I'm pointing for weather forecastors [sic] school after being in the field - think I could use a few of Miss Stone's math courses for that -

Good to hear about the boys from all over the world - I should be able to have a real gab fast when this thing is over -
