Dear Miss McGlynn

Greetings from the sunny clime of Italy – and so far living over here hasn't been too bad at all. There is no need for giving you any details of what we have seen so far because most of the gang that arrived here before me have already given you back there at Salem a good idea of what it is like.

I wanted you to know how very sorry I was to have missed you and Priscilla while I was at Greensboro but we must have moved out a day or so before your card arrived. It finally caught up with me at my next Camp before we left the states –

What we have seen of the country has been a surprise – the cities have been hit hard – but the country about the cities hasn't been affected too much.

I hope to see Lodi or some of the other boys in a few days
